

## An Loving Memory



Clement Jackson was born to Cleveland and Fannie Harris Jackson August 6, 1930 in Willow Oklahoma. In 1931, the Family relocated to Shawnee, Oklahoma.

At an early age, Clement was added to the Lord's Church at the Bell and Farrall Church, Shawnee, Oklahoma.

Clement attended Dunbar High - Shawnee, Oklahoma, where he earned four letters in football and two letters in band. But it was football that made him a star. He played Halfback on the '46, '47, '48 and '49 Dunbar Football Squad, leading Dunbar to two State Championships and one runners up position in three of the four years where he played.

A very quick and explosive runner, he was called "Crazy Legs" because of his running similares to "Elroy Hirsch". Clement scored the winning touchdown in the '47 Championship game to give Dunbar the 14-7 victory over Luther by scoring both touchdowns.

After his outstanding High School career, Clement entered into the US Army in 1950 where he won the Golden Glove and the US Army Lightweight Boxing Championship.

He was awarded four battle stars and the Korean Service Medal. After his army discharge June 14,1952 Clement married the love of his life, Daisy L. Brown, from Brooksville, Oklahoma, and to this union eight children were born.

After a very brief illness, surrounded by his loving and supportive family, Clement departed this life March 22, 2021, at Norman Regional Hospital in Norman, Oklahoma.


