Obituary

Carol Virginia White Roberts was born to Carl Jackson White and Essie Bertheenia White on July 28, 1954, in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Although Carol was the only child, her childhood was accompanied by her cousin's love, Vickie Boykins, as Vickie was raised with her as her big sister. Carol's elementary and middle school education was obtained at Edwards Elementary School and Bishop John Carroll Private School. Carol graduated high school at the top of her class from Northwest Classen High School in 1971. She then later received her Bachelor of Science Degree in Education from the University of Oklahoma in 1975. In addition, she completed several hours in master's level courses at Central State University, although she was unable to complete her degree due to family obligations.

Carol was employed by the Oklahoma City Public School District (OKCPS) for over 40 years. At OKCPS, she began her teaching career in elementary education from 1975- 1980 as a kindergarten teacher. As she progressed in her career, from 1980 to 1999, Carol taught middle school special education. She then taught high school special education from 2000 until her retirement in 2018 from Douglass High School.

In 1980, Carol met one of her biggest blessings, the love of her life George C. Roberts Jr., at a teacher's social event. God saw it fit for the two to unionize on June 14, 1986. Together they shared two sons and a daughter - Marcus, Mancini, and Phylicia. Family was important to Carol, as she was a devoted caretaker for her mother and son Mancini until they departed from this Earth. In her spare time, Carol enjoyed spending quality time with her family, playing the piano, sewing, and listening and dancing to her favorite artist, James Brown. Carol also enjoyed traveling with her husband. They traveled to several islands together, such as Hawaii, the Bahamas, and Jamaica.

At an early age, Carol gave her life to Christ and was baptized at Greater Cleaves Memorial CME Church, where she remained a faithful member. Carol served on the Stewardess Board, the Board of Evangelism, and was a District Women's Missionary Society member. Her love for serving the Lord extended to her church and her husband's church, where she was a Deaconess alongside her husband at Community Baptist Church in Wewoka, Oklahoma. Carol's community involvement included her membership with the American Federation of Teachers (AFT), National Women in Agriculture Association, and Westside Alive Red Hatters. Carol's caring spirit and love for helping special needs children inspired her and George to establish their own family organization, Circle R Disability Ranch. Circle R Disability Ranch is focused on providing horse therapy to special needs children.

The Lord called his Angel Carol to be with him on Friday, November 19, 2021, after a battle with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS). Carol was preceded in death by her parents, two sons, and cousin Vickie. She leaves to cherish her memory, her devoted husband George C. Roberts Jr., daughter Phylicia C. Roberts, grandchildren Jaek, Darius, Darien, Mia, Desire, Saniyah, and future grandson David III, eight great-grandchildren, one uncle James S. White from Wichita Falls, Texas, sister-in-laws Georgetta, Mildred, Mary (Oscar), Lavon (Larry), brother-in-laws Milford (Janice) and Alvin (Vonnice), and a host of family and friends.



