




My Love,

Obituary

After a courageous attempt at recovery following a motorcycle accident in September 2021, Cardell Williams Barkus, Jr. succumbed to his injuries on January 1, 2022.

He was the first born to Reverend Cardell Barkus and Sister Brenda Williams Barkus in Oklahoma City on September 14, 1975.

Cardell graduated from Del City High School in 1994, having played football and participated in Jazz Band throughout his high school career. Shortly after high school, he joined the United States Navy and served abroad the USS Dwight D. Eisenhower until August of 1997. Cardell continued seeking knowledge by accumulating various industry-specific certifications, culminating in receipt of his Associate of Science degree in Network Systems Administration in 2016.

At the time of his passing, Cardell had held the position of IT Director at Remington Park for more than 12 years.

He enjoyed spending time with his family, whether it be at a family and friends BBQ, or serving as a mentor to his cousins. An avid OU fan, he attended many games with his friends from Crimson Nation Tailgators. Additionally, he enjoyed taking a ride on his motorcycle or kicking back with a good cigar.

A devoted husband, father, stepfather, and grandfather. Cardell is survived by his wife, Michelle "Birdie" Ellis-Barkus, married 9 years; his children: Cardell Williams Barkus, III and Chade Lanae Barkus; his stepchildren: Mikiel D. Ellis and Geordan T. Jenkins; his grandchildren: Athena Ellis and Apollo Ellis who lovingly called him PaPa! He also leaves to cherish his memory, a host of aunts, uncles, and cousins who affectionately called him Cody.
