

Obituary

Joe Louis Plunkett was born August 18, 1939 to David Lewis and Estella Ruth Plunkett in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

Joe attended Frederick Douglass High School in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and was in the graduating class of 1957. After graduating from high school, he entered the United States Army Reserve and served two years of service (1958-1960).
